Tutoring Centres

Tutoring is available at all campuses through Library and Learning Services. You can book an appointment with a tutor through an online booking system.

Learning Assistants provide tutoring to Sheridan students at no additional cost in a variety of subjects, such as English, math, architecture, interior design and decorating, accounting, finance, computer programming, chemistry, and more. Assistants are co-op students who work in the Tutoring Centres on each campus.

Practice in conversation skills, basic computing skills and presentation skills is also available in a group setting.

Peer-Assisted Learning (PAL) leaders

are available in a variety of first-year courses too. PAL leaders are Sheridan students who are recommended by faculty and who help other students review notes, discuss readings, develop study skills, and prepare for tests and assignments.

Peer tutors offer course-specific tutoring in subjects outside of those provided by the Learning Assistants. Peer tutors are Sheridan students who earn a grade of 76% or higher in the course they tutor in, and are referred by professors.

Check the program availability and admission requirements

Admission to Sheridan can be competitive and some programs can fill quickly. Be sure to check program availability before applying through www.studyatsheridan.ca

Check the admission requirements for your program of choice online or on pages 16-27. International applicants must meet the course equivalencies of the Canadian admission requirements. Apply online and pay the application fee

You can apply online at internationalapp.sheridancollege.ca

You’ll need a computer with an internet connection and a credit card to pay the application fee.

The “equal consideration” date for September intake is February 1, 2022 (we encourage you to apply before then). We’ll accept your application after that date provided the program is still open as indicated on our website.

Submit your documentation

Academic and other required documents can be submitted directly within the online application, or through **Sheridan's Applicant Portal** after you submit your application.

Please note that these documents must be accompanied by a notarized, official translation into English along with original transcript in your native language. Please merge all the pages of a document into a single PDF file before uploading.

If you're applying to a program which requires a portfolio or other supplemental assessment, instructions for these requirements will be available in **Sheridan's Applicant Portal** after you submit your application.

Monitor your application! Be sure to check your Sheridan Applicant Portal regularly to view completed and outstanding admission requirements, submit additional requirements, view application status updates and decisions, and much more.

Decisions will also be communicated to you by email. If you're offered admission to a program, you must accept your offer in your Sheridan Applicant Portal.

After we receive your acceptance of our offer of admission, the invoice for your program will be available online after 2-3 business days and 4 months prior to your program start date. Please be sure to meet all deadlines for accepting your offer, paying your fees and completing the outstanding admission requirements if your offer is conditional.

What you need to get where you want

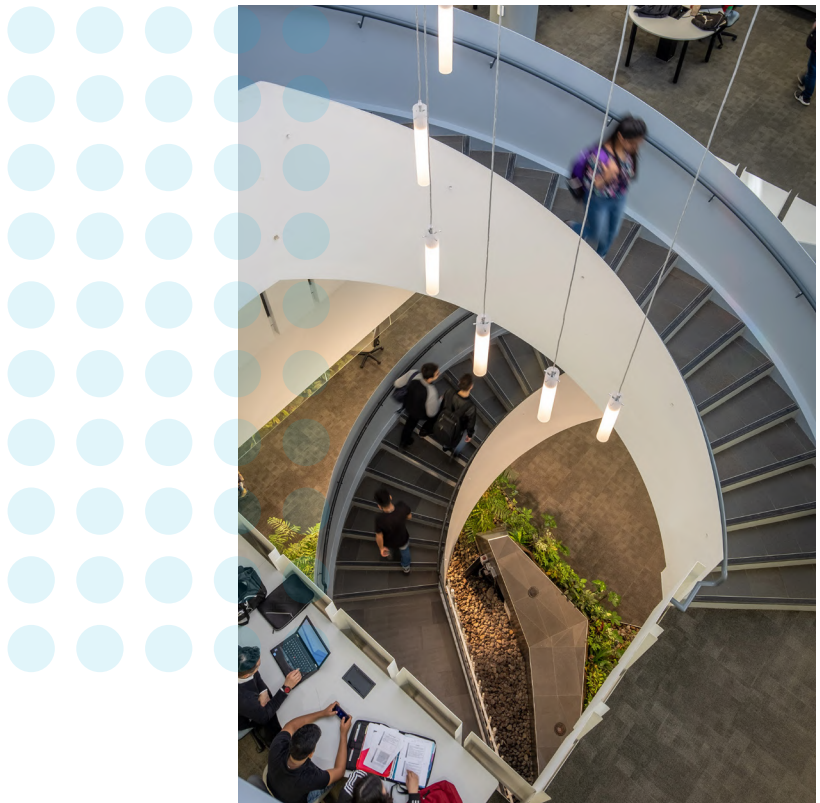
Undergraduate

Applicants may be admitted to Sheridan as full-time students if they have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent high school diploma including one senior-level English or equivalent IELTS/TOEFL plus any additional required courses listed. Eligible applicants will be selected on the basis of their previous academic achievement.

Post-graduate programs

To be considered for admission an applicant must have a minimum postsecondary diploma or degree.

Eligible applicants are selected on the basis of previous academic achievement, and/or demonstrated experience and additional admission requirements where required.



English proficiency

All applicants to Sheridan must demonstrate competency in English and may be required to complete English testing. Sheridan recognizes valid TOEFL and IELTS scores.

Applicants with a minimum of three years high school in Canada, Australia, Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria, New Zealand, Singapore, U.S., U.K. and some Caribbean* countries will be exempted from TOEFL/IELTS requirements upon provision of a full transcript.

Applicants from Canadian curriculum high schools outside of Canada with minimum of three years high school credits will be exempted from TOEFL/IELTS requirements upon provision of a full transcript.

*Excluding International applicants from Cuba, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Puerto Rico and other countries where the curriculum is not taught in English.

Successful completion of at least two years of study in an accredited college, recognized by Sheridan, in English, is sufficient to demonstrate competency in English.

Successful completion of at least one year of study in an accredited university, recognized by Sheridan, or successful completion of a one-year post-graduate certificate at an accredited college, recognized by Sheridan, in English, is sufficient to demonstrate competency in English.

Sheridan reserves the right to require proof of proficiency in English from any applicant, or applicants, from individual schools, school systems, regions or countries. Applicants may be required to complete English testing to demonstrate proficiency.

Advertising – Account Management (2020)

Pilon School of Business

After emigrating from Lebanon, where she'd worked in the banking industry for nearly a decade, Alia wanted Canadian working experience that could help her shift careers. That's what she got during her co-op placement at Sheridan's Entrepreneurship Discovery and Growth Engine (EDGE), where Alia researched and developed content that promoted the hub's services, visibility and brand. "For someone like me who left her home in hopes of landing a job in advertising, EDGE supported me in my mission," says Alia, who is now employed by Oliver Agency in Toronto as an Account Executive. "It shared my values of teamwork, contagious curiosity, passion and dedication to drive progress, and it also allowed me to wear many hats and learn on the go."

Sarvesh Badhwar

Computer Systems Technology – Software Development and Network Engineering (2020)

Faculty of Applied Science and Technology

The more opportunities Sarvesh took advantage of at Sheridan, the easier it was to find the next one. "My idea was to get a taste of everything," says Sarvesh, who completed co-op placements with Sheridan, Deloitte Canada and RBC (Royal Bank of Canada) in addition to holding extracurricular positions as an international student representative, student senate member and Peer Mentor. "Eventually, I had gained so many different skills and experiences that it became very easy for me to get interviews with employers." In fact, Sarvesh was offered his first job before he even graduated, securing a Technology Analyst position with international IT consulting company Accenture.



Tharindra Illangasinghe

Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL Plus) (2020)

Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences

Tharindra was certified to teach English in her native Sri Lanka, but she didn't feel well-equipped to be an effective instructor. That changed after a year at Sheridan, where the Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages graduate certificate program exposed Tharindra to different teaching approaches, gave her a better understanding of the English language and gave her valuable experience. "It was a whole new world. Just by watching my professors, I learned a lot about teaching," says Tharindra, who spent five months working for Sheridan as a part-time English teacher after she graduated. "Before I left Sri Lanka, I applied to teach at a lot of places but did not receive a positive response from most of them. When I returned, I got called for many interviews and am now working with two reputed organizations. It really worked out for me."



Teenaz Javat

Canadian Journalism for Internationally Trained Writers (2008)

Faculty of Animation, Arts & Design

After working for five years as a print journalist in India and Pakistan, Teenaz put her career on hold when she immigrated to Canada in 1997. She spent the next eight years as a stay-at-home mom to her two children. Sheridan's former Canadian Journalism for Internationally Trained Writers graduate certificate program helped Teenaz transition back into the field and build a network of contacts during a six-week internship at the *Toronto Star*. "I got a few stories with my byline published, which was definitely a door-opener," says Teenaz. "The opportunity to work at the *Star* enabled me to get a toehold in the business. A month later, I was called in to interview as a casual contributor for the CBC, and I'm still there 13 years later."



Riegel Smith

Community and Justice Services (2021)

Faculty of Applied Health and Community Studies

Having served as a volunteer youth mentor in his native Jamaica, Riegel appreciates the value of new experiences. Even though practicums weren't mandatory in his program during the COVID-19 pandemic, Riegel volunteered at Brampton's Salvation Army Cuthbert House, an open custody and detention facility that helps reintegrate young males into the community. "My professor said it would look good on my résumé, and it gave me experience, built my confidence and made me more marketable," says the former teacher. Riegel was hired as a full-time youth support supervisor at Our Place Peel, a Mississauga emergency youth shelter, shortly after he graduated. "I interviewed for a support worker role, but they ended up offering me a supervisor position after seeing my experience and the way I spoke and conducted myself."

English as a Second Language (ESL)

Sheridan offers full-time, intensive English as a Second Language (ESL) classes for students who want to improve their English skills. The program features:

- Five levels of instruction: Foundation, Pre-intermediate, Intermediate, Advanced and English for Academic Purposes (EAP). EAP can provide students with a conditional acceptance into a diploma, degree or post-graduate certificate at Sheridan.
- Students will be placed in the appropriate level based on their choice of TOEFL, IELTS or Sheridan's on-campus placement test.

ESL sessions – except for EAP level – last seven weeks (25 hours of study/week) and cost \$3,634CDN.

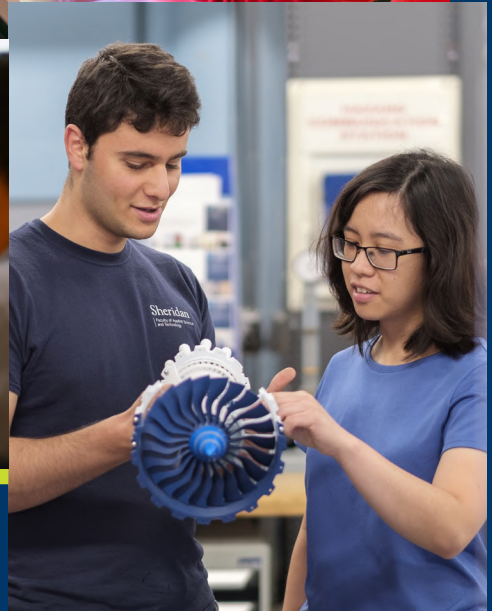
